ILD1010 Fundamentals of Illustrative Design

This freshman-level course provides an overview of illustrative design as a creative practice and introduces students to the fundamentals of illustration within graphic design. Students explore the differences between graphic design, illustration, and illustrative design and how illustrative design can elevate a brand. Upon the successful completion of this course, students will have a basic process of approaching a design problem through illustration.
